China and US finally meet to talk tariffs

Summary: U.S. Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and Trade Representative Jamieson Greer will meet Chinese Vice Premier He Lifeng in Switzerland this weekend, marking the first step towards resolving the bilateral trade dispute.

Summary: Shanghai Auto Show is the world's largest car exhibition. At this year's edition, Chinese automakers unveiled their newest electric vehicle models with a focus on AI, intelligent software, and innovative vehicle designs.

Summary: Chinese e-commerce exports to the US fell by 65% in Q1 due to new import restrictions, while shipments to the EU rose by 28%. Shein, a major market player, now considers mitigating the impact by moving production to new locations.

Large spike in foreign travelers after visa waivers

Summary: China saw a 43% increase in foreign visitors during this year's Labor Day holiday, driven by expanded visa-free policies and enhanced tax rebates. Over 380,000 inbound trips were made visa-free, marking a 72.7% year-on-year surge.

Pakistan vows retaliation after Indian air strikes

Summary: India launched air strikes on Pakistan and Pakistan-administered Kashmir; triggering promises of retaliation from Islamabad. Both countries exchanged fire, raising fears of broader conflict, though leaders on both sides signaled a desire to avoid war.


